Pastor's Message

Dear Friends:

Today is World Mission Sunday and the theme for this year is "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard."

I remember a funny episode when I returned for home leave in the summer of 2011 after my first year of serving as Rector of our seminary in Nairobi, Kenya. The administrative assistant of Moreau Seminary asked me if I had picked up my accumulated mail. I asked her where it was. She said, "Well, since you are a missionary, it's down in the Holy Cross Mission Center where you have a mail slot." I never thought of myself as a missionary until that moment. In my mind, I was just a priest working at our seminary in Kenya.

Two years later, I was elected District Superior and began to travel throughout Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, visiting our houses of formation, parishes, and schools. I met so many wonderful people wherever I visited who were always so welcoming, warm, and gracious towards me.

In time, I realized two important lessons. The first lesson came when I realized that the men of Holy Cross in East Africa truly considered me their brother, even though I hailed from America. Deep down, I understood that we were all part of the Holy Cross family, with a shared heritage, spirituality, and mission entrusted to us by our founder, Fr. Basil Moreau. Our vows bound us together as brothers in community and as a religious family. It is a wonderful thing to feel accepted, loved, and at home so many thousands of miles away from my native land. I have many Holy Cross brothers and sisters in East Africa.

The other lesson was occasioned by the connection I felt as a priest with the Catholic communities I met in Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania. Whether it was talking with students and teachers at our primary and secondary schools in these countries or saying Mass in one of our parishes, I felt on a deeper level that we were truly brothers and sisters in Christ.

If I could share one thing of what I have seen and heard in East Africa, it would simply be that we are one. Human culture and traditions, as beautiful and enriching as they are, are only skin deep. Deep down we are all the same: we have the same human needs and wants, the same dreams for our children, and the same hopes for our world.

It is an amazing thing to realize that there are 1.34 billion Catholics in the world, which is about 18% of the world's population. We belong to a big Catholic family and we have more brothers and sisters than we ever dreamed possible. We are all disciples of Jesus Christ and have an impressive and varied mission that spans the entire globe. To see and understand this is to have the heart of a missionary.
