HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

For the week of October 14th we have served 14 families with \$2,708 in food & utility/rent assistance. Holy Redeemer church/school donated 329 lbs of food and volunteers offered 47 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifice.

We currently are able to provide more emergency rent and utility assistance—to persons who are facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to persons/households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.) We are able to provide this assistance thanks to the generosity of parishioners, and recently with additional funds from a grant from the Oregon Community Foundation.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

We have <u>volunteer openings for Saturday</u>, 2:15 - 4:00pm in the HR Food Pantry in the basement of the church. Volunteers work once every 4 weeks.

During the COVID emergency, only volunteers work in the pantry packing boxes to give out to clients and their families. All volunteers are wearing masks and using gloves.

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

My favorite year in the seminary was the year I spent at our novitiate in beautiful Cascade, Colorado, in the foothills of Pikes Peak. We novices lived in the old Cusack family mansion and cottage that had been donated to Holy Cross some years back. The Novitiate Year is a non-academic year that is primarily focused on personal prayer, growth in self-awareness, and developing a deeper understanding of religious

life in Holy Cross. The pace of life is slower and there is ample time for hikes, hobbies, and spiritual reading.

One Saturday at the end of September of my novitiate year, a group of guys were driving to see the aspen trees in their golden fall regalia. I opted to stay behind to read the classic spiritual work of St. Therese of Lisieux, *The Story of a Soul*. As it turned out, it started snowing pretty heavily that day in the mountains. I fetched a cup of hot chocolate, and as I cozied up to my book and watched the falling snow, I felt that I had chosen the better portion.

That holy little book made a huge impression on me. I hadn't really read spiritual books up until that point. In some wonderful way, St. Therese became a spiritual guide and friend to me.

Over the course of the year I read other works by Catholic spiritual writers, such as *The Seven Story Mountain* by Thomas Merton, and *The Way of Perfection* by St. Teresa of Avila. I also found time to read the *Lord of the Rings* trilogy by J.R.R. Tolkien. They kind of lit a fire within me.

To this day, I try to keep a spiritual book on my night stand. It's almost as if each author I've read over the years has become a friend to me, bringing the kind of insight and perspective on life that only a trusted friend can offer.

If any of you would ever care to share the title of your 2-3 favorite spiritual books via email, I would love to hear from you. I would also happily publish a list of these books in some future bulletin column. In a world where we can often feel depressed by the constant barrage of bad news, good spiritual reading can uplift and inspire us.
