HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our

rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. VOLUNTEERS FOR MONTHLY MEAL SERVICE AT ST. ANDRE BESSETTE DOWNTOWN

Our Holy Redeemer Conference of St. Vincent de Paul will again be providing a monthly meal service at St. Andre Bessette downtown, in their commercial kitchen. The time commitment is typically less than 4 hours a month and Holy Redeemer Catholic School Fair Share Hours are available to school families that participate. Holy Redeemer will be hosting the second Fridays of the month, starting in October and our goal is to form a team of about 8 volunteers. Anyone with experience in restaurants/food carts to help coordinate the preparation, packaging and distribution of the to-go meals would be very appreciated.

Work starts with the meal preparation 3:00- 4:00pm followed by serving the meal and then of course clean up. At this point, the meals are boxed "to-go" with hopes of moving to "stay and eat "dining room service in the future.

Fr. Michael's Message



NOVEMBER: The Month of Remembrance

This Tuesday, we begin the 11th month of our calendar year: November.

The word "November" comes from the Latin word "novem" which means "nine". Why nine? Because the Roman Empire's calendar had 10 months and November was the 9th month. Two more months were added later in the summer months which is why the 9th month for Romans became the 11th month for us.

This month, given our hemisphere's climate during the autumn months, gives us a sense of the earth's diminishment, the harvest of crops, the decreased sunlight and less warmth, the earth's "dying" which calls to mind our own mortality.

So, the first day of November is celebrated with the Holy Day of All Saints.

We start off praising God for all those who were baptized and lived out their Christian faith, begun at their Baptism. We acknowledge those who are recognized as being with God in heaven and are canonized, officially recognized as residents of heavens and members of the Communion of Saints. This day is so important for the Church that it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

On the second day of November, we celebrate and intercede for every person who has died through the Masses of All Souls. Again, we trust that our relationship with them has changed because of death but is not ended. All of the love and affection that knits us together in life does not unravel upon a person's death. This is our faith in God's promise of Life and the coming of the Resurrection for us all.

Every year, during November, we set up a Table of Remembrance below the icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help. This custom originates with Spanish-speakers and as we place a picture of our deceased loved ones, we pray for them and their journey to the Father, we pray for their total reconciliation with God, the forgiveness of their sins - and ours - as we desire all of us to be with God in heaven.

We especially recognize our mortality and our conviction that Life endures beyond death. We hold a deep respect for our physical bodies and reverence for them even after death. As a local poet wrote,

"And facing Death, fearless, we stand and behold The spark of Life quenched, A fire from God which Love has bestowed, The vibrant energy of our mortal frame now grows old, To enter a grave in the earth so cold Until Resurrection lifts us up in Christ ever-bold!"

In Baptism, we died with Christ and were buried with Him. Yet, in Baptism, we were also raised with Him to new Life. Death has no more power even though we rightly mourn the deaths of our loved ones and remember them during this month.

Eternal rest grant upon them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.

May the souls of all of the faithful departed rest in peace!

Amen. Alleluia!
