Guest speaker and dinner (\$95 per person) at 7:30pm follows. Rev. Tadeusz Pacholczyk, Ph.D., a priest of the Diocese of Fall River, Massachusetts, earned his doctorate in neuroscience from Yale and did postdoctoral work at Harvard. Currently, he serves as the Director of Education at The National Catholic Bioethics Center in Philadelphia and directs the Center's National Catholic Certification Program in Health Care Ethics.



HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility

assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. VOLUNTEERS FOR MONTHLY MEAL SERVICE AT ST. ANDRE BESSETTE DOWNTOWN

Our Holy Redeemer Conference of St. Vincent de Paul will again be providing a monthly meal service at St. Andre Bessette downtown, in their commercial kitchen. The time commitment is typically less than 4 hours a month and Holy Redeemer Catholic School Fair Share Hours are available to school families that participate.

Holy Redeemer will be hosting the second Fridays of the month, starting in October and our goal is to form a team of about 8 volunteers. Anyone with experience in restaurants/food carts to help coordinate the preparation, packaging and distribution of the to-go meals would be very appreciated.

The Pastor of St. Andre Bessette will provide an orientation for our volunteers on our first Friday and will explain any safety concerns to help everyone feel confident and assured that clients can be served with dignity and respect. Volunteers will need to be comfortable with using stairs in the work space.

Work starts with the meal preparation 3:00- 4:00pm followed by serving the meal and then of course clean up. At this point, the meals are boxed "to-go" with hopes of moving to "stay and eat "dining room service in the future.

Fr. Pat's Message

Dear Friends:

Recently we celebrated the Feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, as well as the Feast of the Guardian Angels. I know that in my seminary training, we really never spent any time reflecting on the existence of angels or their role in salvation history.

What is clear is that Christ himself believed in angels. He himself stated, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven..." (Matthew 18:10). When Christ called Nathaniel, he said to him, "Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man" (John 1:51).

A great story about angels came to me from my best friend back in La Porte, Indiana. His daughter was just old enough to talk but she had not yet really been instructed in the faith. He told me that for several months, while at Mass, when the moment of the consecration of the bread and wine took place, she would whisper, "Daddy, I see angels above the altar." My friend was amazed, as there were no images of angels in the sanctuary. But he had no reason to doubt her.

To me, the amazing thing about angels is that they not only do God's bidding, but they primarily exist to assist, guide, and protect us. We human beings are, after all, the crowning glory of God's creation. Psalm 8:5 puts it this way: "You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor."

October is Respect Life Month for us Catholics in the United States. Maybe reflecting on angels, especially our guardian angels, is a fitting place to start with the idea of respecting human life. Each human life, from conception to natural death, has infinite worth and is clothed with divine glory and honor. Like the guardian angels, we are called to assist, guide, and defend every vulnerable human being—whether in the womb, on our streets, on our borders, in our prisons, in homes for the elderly, in youth who struggle with their sexuality, in those who struggle with their mental health, and those dying in hospice care.

Let's not lose sight of the fact that we each have a guardian angel. I cannot prove it, but I'm willing to bet that it is true. So I'll leave you with a two quotes from the saints to get us pondering more deeply the mystery of these divine helpers of the human race:

"How great is the dignity of souls, that each person from birth received an angel to protect it." St. Jerome

"How happy is that guardian angel who accompanies a soul to Holy Mass!" – St. John Vianney
