# HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

As of 9/9/2020, we've served 25 families with \$2,750 in food. Holy Redeemer church/school



donated 1,828 lbs of food and volunteers offered 47 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifices.

Our SVDP Food Room is open Wednesdays and Saturdays 2:30-4:00pm. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to visit us there for assistance; all requests are treated confidentially.

We currently are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-to persons who are facing utility cutoff or eviction. We currently offer up to \$500 in rent and \$300 in utility assistance to help individuals or families, limited to once a year. Assistance is provided to persons/households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.) We are able to provide this assistance thanks to the generosity of parishioners, and recently with additional funds from a grant from the Oregon Community Foundation.



# Pastor's Message



Dear Families of Holy Redeemer:

As you know, the U.S. Bishops called for a day of prayer and fasting for racial healing on September 9, on the Memorial of St. Peter Claver. We had a simple prayer service in the church that we live-streamed on Facebook. I thought that I would share with you my opening comments:

"Brothers and sisters: On June 3, 2020, we were shocked and shaken as we witnessed in horror the senseless killing of George Floyd in Minneapolis and the national protest that followed. As members of the Church, we know that we cannot turn a blind eye when citizens are deprived of their human dignity and even their lives.

As Catholics, we know that racism is a sin: a sin that divides the human family, blots out the image of God among specific members of that family, and violates the fundamental human dignity of those who are children of God.

As our bishops have pointed out, racism is a life issue. Our efforts to build a culture of life need to include a commitment by all of us to combat racism, and its effects in our civic and social institutions, especially in law enforcement. This commitment needs to bring to an end the indifference that has allowed the evil of racism to persist. Some may believe it is enough to be non-racist, but history has shown the need for more. We need to be actively anti-racist.

Tonight we join many parishes across this land to conclude a day of prayer and fasting for racial healing. Ultimately, the healing of racism means the healing of the human heart. Tonight we join our hearts to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, where every human being is loved and cherished.

As Christians, we believe in the power of prayer and fasting, because that is how Christ brought about human healing. This past Sunday, Jesus said that whenever two of us agree on anything in prayer, it will be granted to us. Tonight there are more than two of us! So we take Christ at his word as we ask for racial healing in our land.

We invoke St. Peter Claver on his feast day, a humble priest who served in Colombia, and went into the hold of every slave ship when it arrived at port, bringing food, medicine, brandy, and words of comfort to people who suffered horribly on their journey to that land. He denounced slavery from the city square, and who took on planters and slave owners from every pulpit at which he preached. The Holy Spirit's might and power is manifested in the bold action of Peter Claver. May the same be said of us.

We will invoke the Litany of Black Catholic saints to pray with us for our nation this night. They displayed immense courage in the face of unrelenting racism. May their prayers, joined with ours, free our land from the scourge of racism and bring peace and harmony to America.
