# HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

**EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE:** Our SVDP Food Room is open Wednesdays and Saturdays 2:30-4:00pm. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to visit; all requests are treated confidentially. Another resource is Oregonfoodfinder.org.

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS: Ground or instant coffee, sugar in 1 or 5 lb. bags, garden produce . You can bring these to the rectory or to the Food Room during Wednesday & Saturday hours.







**RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE:** We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Ainsworth/ N. Killingsworth to the Columbia River and MLK to NE 22nd Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners.

### FOR THE WEEKS ENDING:

9/2/21, we've served 63 families with \$6,152 in food/rent/utilities. Holy Redeemer Church/School donated 1,861lbs. of food and volunteers offered 47 hours of time.

9/9/21, we've served 13 families with \$1,615 in food/rent/utilities. Holy Redeemer Church/School donated 740lbs. of food and volunteers offered 37 hours of time. **Thank you for your ongoing sacrifices and love.**

# THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE BOOK OF GOSPELS

In the Entrance Procession, a deacon carries aloft the <u>Book of</u> <u>the Gospels</u>. It's the only book carried in procession because it is unlike any other book we have. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John contain the words and works of Jesus Christ. So, as the processional cross leads the way, the Word, who came among us in human flesh, is in our midst.



The Book of the Gospels is laid upon the altar at the beginning of

Mass because the altar is focal place where we behold the presence of the Lord - in the Eucharist under the sacramental forms of bread and wine and in the Word, which is proclaimed, and continues to speak to us.

The <u>Book of the Gospels</u> is held high during the Gospel Acclamation at the altar. This gesture parallels the action of the priest who will also lift up the consecrated bread and wine to which we give our Amen.

And as the Gospel is proclaimed for us by deacon or priest, it is Christ Himself who speaks to us again, as His Body, gathered in His Spirit, as we journey toward the Kingdom.



# **Pastor's Message**



Dear Friends:

Like most of you, I've lived through the first pandemic of my lifetime and hopefully the last. None of us could have foreseen the duration of this pandemic and just when we thought we were emerging from it all, we have to confront the Delta variant. So much

for putting my more creative masks into a scrapbook. There will be many more mornings, it seems, of trying to greet students and their parents through fogged up lenses!

A number of you have asked about Mass attendance because you have noticed that none of our Masses are approaching the numbers we saw pre-Covid. We have been tracking Mass attendance the past few months and are basically at 50% of what we registered in November of 2019. Granted, Masses in the summer are usually less attended because of family vacations, but it's still significantly lower Mass attendance than usual.

I think the main issue for most families is that their children are not yet vaccinated. Until that happens they simply do not feel safe bringing them to larger public gatherings, even if people are masked. Those who are older with underlying conditions, even though fully vaccinated, feel it wiser to avoid any risk of infection until the whole pandemic has passed.

We are certainly left wondering what the church attendance landscape will look like post-Covid 19. According to a survey conducted in July and August of last year by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate, not many young adult Catholics were tuning into Masses on television or online. A more troubling finding is that 36 percent said they planned to attend Mass less frequently when the churches fully reopen.

Also of interest is a recent Gallup poll about church attendance trends released in March of this year. It shows that Americans' membership in houses of worship continued to decline last year, dropping below 50% for the first time in Gallup's eight-decade trend. In 2020, 47% of Americans said they belonged to a church, synagogue or mosque, down from 50% in 2018 and 70% in 1999.

I would suggest that we not push the panic button, regardless of current trends. Let us wait and see what the landscape looks like when this pandemic finally lifts. Each of us, however, can reach out to parishioners we know and encourage them to come back to Sunday Mass. We are all members of the Holy Redeemer family but never more so than when we gather in faith to encounter and receive Christ in word and sacrament. And hopefully we aren't too far away from enjoying each other's company again at Breakfast Club, the Italian dinner, fish fries, Silver Spirits, and the Altar Society tea!
