

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Without a doubt the oldest institution in all of human history is marriage. It is the first institution that God established, before the existence of government or even the church. The well-being of both church and society depend on healthy

marriages. Marriage is also the best means of assuring the well-being of children. The Catholic Church is not shy about referring to the family as a domestic church.

Married couples know better than anyone that marriage is hard work. My father told me once that being married is never a 50-50 proposition. It's 60-40, meaning that you have to go beyond the minimum to make your marriage work. It is not easy for two human beings to live together and then to raise the new human beings that arrive in their children.

Anyone who has been married would agree that what is most important is their shared faith in God. Marriage is a vocation and a call to holiness. Its purpose is to lead each other closer to God and eventually their children, too. As a Church, we put a lot of energy into preparing young couples for marriage but do very little to assist couples afterwards.

As Pastor, I want endorse any initiative that can help married couples deepen their lives of faith. One such program is called *Marriage in Christ*. We are blessed to have in our parish Jim and Gina Kadera who are trained in offering the five-week *Marriage in Christ Seminar*. *Marriage in Christ Seminar* offers practical suggestions for ways to keep Christ the ongoing center of your marriage, as well as ways to renew and deepen your love and friendship, which is the very fabric of marriage.

One MIC participant wrote, "I didn't have great expectations for the seminar. I was thinking, 'I don't need this.' If you were to ask me how I would have rated my marriage, I would probably have said that we were in the 80th percentile-I'm in marketing, so I round up! We came anyway, and week after week we did the homework. To my great surprise and joy, I found myself loving my wife in new, tangible ways. I have more love and affection for my wife than I did five weeks ago when we started."

Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the in-person sessions have had to move on-line. For more information on how to register for the on-line five-week seminar, you can visit their website at www.marriageinchrist.com or contact parishioners Jim and Gina Kadera at (503) 438-5035.

The cost is \$10 per session but the first session is being offered for free. Thus, the total cost of the *MIC Seminar* is \$40. That's basically the cost of an extra-large carryout pizza with a side of cheesy bread! In other words, this is money well spent. I hope that you might consider participating.
